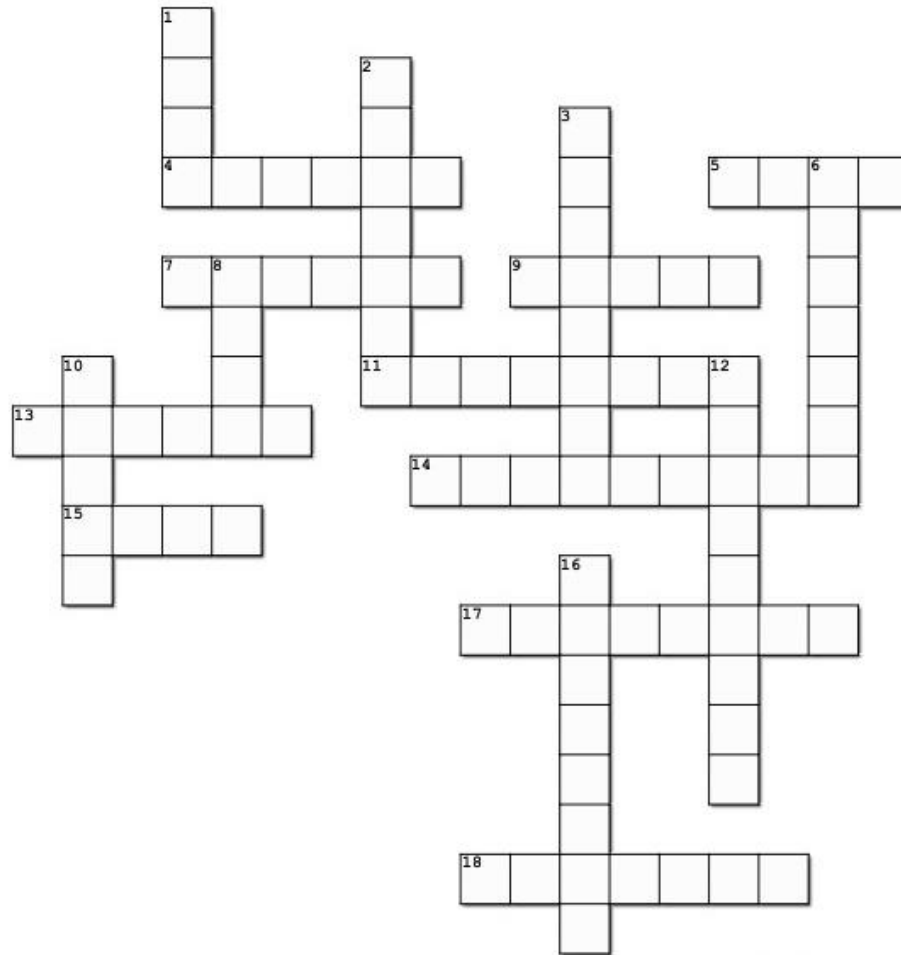


Joel 2:12-13, 28-29

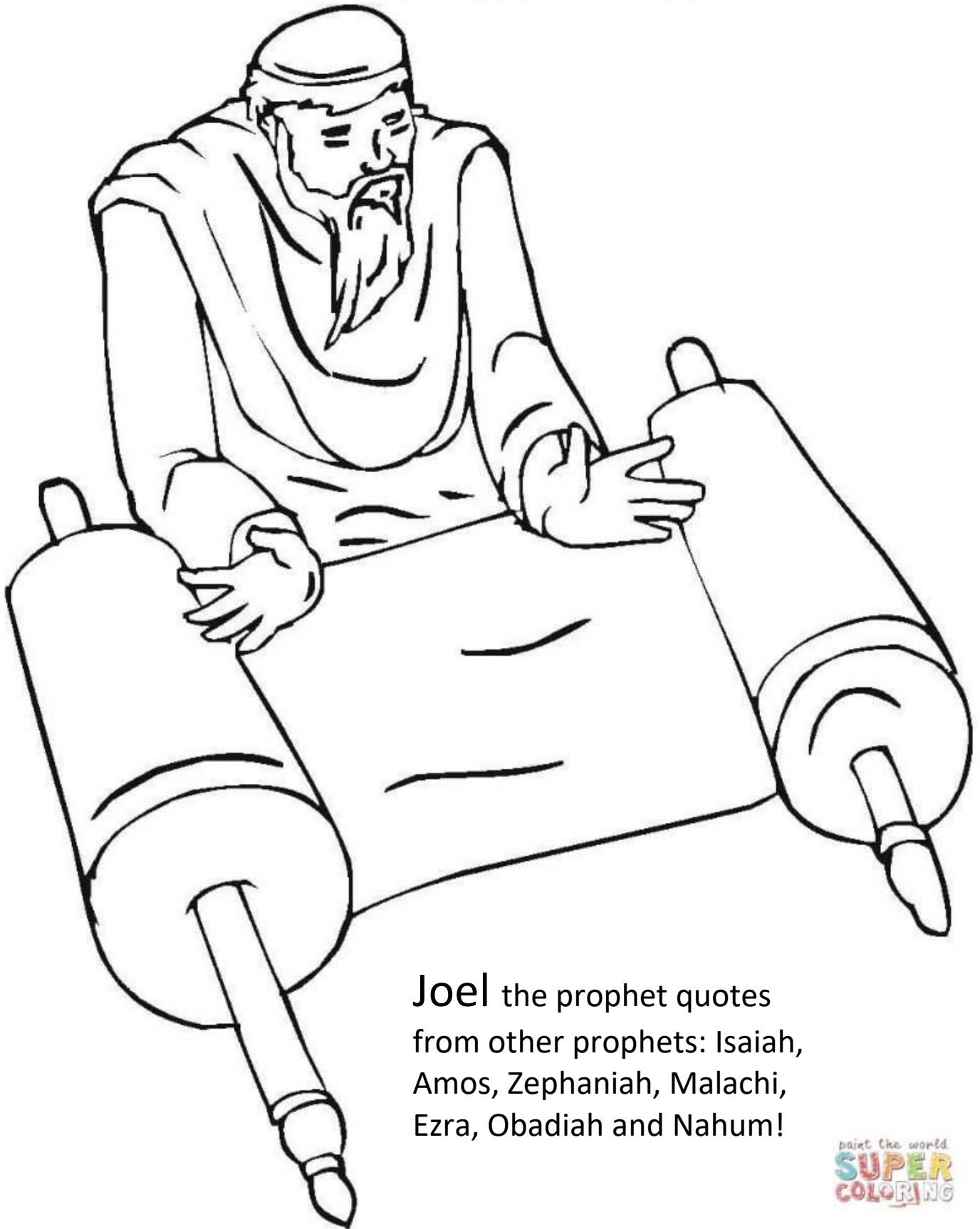

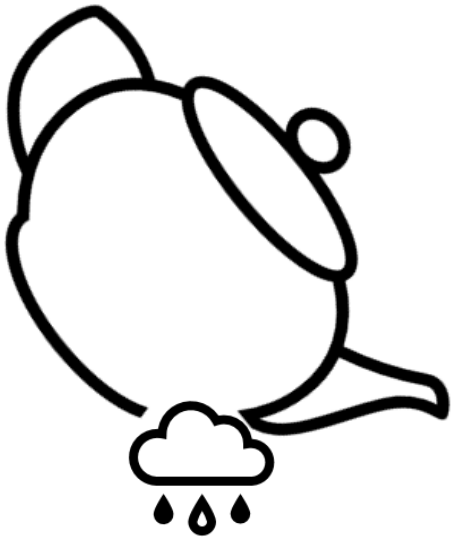
