






The Workers in the Vineyard

Living the Word: Teaching Kids God's Story Narrative Lectionary, Year 1 (2022-2023) **Lesson #1-24** Matthew 20:1-16

LAST WEEK

Jesus teaches his disciples about sin and forgiveness through the Parable of the Unforgiving Servant (Matthew 18:15-35).

THEWEIN

Jesus uses the Parable of the Laborers in the Vineyard to teach his followers about God's generosity in the kingdom of heaven (Matthew 20:1-16).

THEPOINT

God wants us to live generously.

BIBLENUTS & BOLTS

Pharisees

In Jesus' time, the Pharisees were followers of God. They were Jewish people who believed that the most important thing to do as God's chosen people was following God's laws in Scripture. Many of the religious laws that they observed are found in the Book of Leviticus. The Pharisees were often in conflict with Jesus because they believed that he was breaking God's laws. They especially took issue with Jesus healing—working—on the Sabbath, a practice strictly forbidden in Scripture.

STORY SUMMARY

The wealthy landowner in the parable hires laborers to work in his vineyard. He hires some early in the morning, some at midday, and some in the evening. When it comes time to give them their wages, he pays all of the workers the same amount, no matter how long they had been working. Those who had worked the longest were angry with those who had worked for less than an hour. But the landowner told the workers that they had been hired for a day's wage and each had been given a fair wage. He was generous to all.

PRAGIGE SERVICE

We all have unique gifts and talents. These gifts and talents can be used in different ways to serve God and to serve others. The challenge is to find those creative ways of doing service and then to act on them. What makes your family unique? How can you use that to serve others?

NEW WEIN

Jesus tells the Parable of the Wedding Banquet, about a king who throws a lavish wedding celebration for his son and invites people off the streets to attend (Matthew 22:1-14).
