



# THE STORY @ HOME



Living the Word: Teaching Kids God's Story Narrative Lectionary, Year 1 (2022-2023) **Lesson #1-26** Matthew 25:1-13 [or 25:14-30]

#### LAST WEEK

Jesus tells the Parable of the Wedding Banquet, about a king who throws a lavish wedding celebration for his son and invites people off the streets to attend (Matthew 22:1-14).

### KEWEUT

Jesus teaches his disciples about being prepared and using their gifts wisely with the parables of the Ten Bridesmaids and Talents (Matthew 25:1-13 [or 25:14-30]).

#### THEPOINT

We are to use our gifts for God's glory.

#### STORY SUMMARY

Jesus tells a parable of a landowner entrusting money to slaves. A landowner gives three slaves different amounts of money, called talents (a huge amount of money, about 20 years pay each), before he leaves on a trip. Two of the slaves make more with their talents, while the other does nothing. The master is pleased with the two who used their money wisely but displeased with the slave who did not. The slave says that he was afraid, so he did nothing. In the parable, he is sent away. Jesus teaches that God entrusts us with many gifts and desires us to use them boldly for God's glory rather than hiding them away.

#### BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS

#### Culture and Customs

While parables were stories grounded in the everyday life of those Jesus taught, for us, thousands of years later, the premise or meaning of these stories can sometimes be less clear. The culture and customs at the time of Jesus' ministry on earth were very different than our own. Taking time to learn some of those customs as we read Bible stories will help make sense of the passage and give us a better framework with which to interpret it.

#### PRAMITE SERVICE

God entrusts us with many gifts including money, time, and abilities (talents) and calls us to use them to care for those around us. Talk about the individual talents of each family member, and think of a way to use those talents to serve someone this week.

#### NEXT WEEK

Jesus uses the image of separating sheep and goats to tell his disciples that by serving those in need, they are serving him (Matthew 25:31-46).

Use the questions below or other questions you think of to discuss today's Scripture reading (listed above) with your family.

- In what way does this text teach about the Ways of the Kingdom?
- What does this Scripture have to do with our lives today?
- What part of this Scripture is the most interesting to you? Why?

### Family Devotions

As you hear and study these stories each week, consider what God has to say to you and your family. What is God's message to us? How should we respond?

#### Sunday—Read Matthew 25:1-30

The Parable of the Talents.

Share what you feel is your greatest gift or talent. Go around and tell each other what you see is the greatest gift that God has given them.

#### Monday—Read Matthew 22:41-46

The son of David.

What question would you ask Jesus?

#### Tuesday—Read Psalm 110:1-7

A psalm of David.

How does this psalm compare to your image of Jesus?

#### Wednesday—Read Matthew 23:1-12

Humbled and exalted.

Read verse 12 again. What does this mean to you?

#### Thursday—Read Matthew 23:13-26

Iesus warns the Pharisees.

Jesus is warning the Pharisees that, even though they may appear to be good on the outside, their insides are empty and hollow. Make a list of the things that Jesus is accusing the Pharisees of doing.

#### Friday—Read Matthew 23:27-36

Jesus continues to warn the scribes and Pharisees.

#### Saturday—Read Matthew 23:37-39
