Living the Word: Teaching Kids God's Story

Narrative Lectionary, Year 1 (2022-2023)

Lesson #1-33

Romans [3:28-30] 5:1-11

LAST WEEK

Paul begins a letter he wrote to introduce himself and his mission to the people of the church in Rome (Romans 1:1-17).

THIS WEEK

Paul elaborates on his major concern, the heart of the gospel message, which is the death of Christ as the fulfillment of God's promises (Romans [3:28-30] 5:1-11).

STORY SUMMARY

We cannot heal our own relationship with God, which is broken on account of sin. Reconciliation with God is a gift that comes to us through the love of God in Jesus, and through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. God, seeing our weakness and knowing our predicament, loved us and came to our rescue. God's love for humanity has been shown in the death of Christ, who died for us even though we had done nothing to deserve it. This truth helps us understand how we can rejoice even when life is difficult and we go through times of trial and suffering.

PRACTICE SERVICE

Service is putting love into action. As members of the church, we work together to serve each other and other people. Think of one way that you can help as a family at your church this month.

Through God's grace, we have peace and hope.

BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS

Letters

The apostles wrote letters to teach others about Jesus. Much of the New Testament is composed of letters written to teach Christians with both general and specific instructions. These letters were central in terms of spreading faith and fellowship across far-flung communities and into remote areas. They were also instrumental in shaping the church by spreading the news of Jesus's sacrifice and God's never-ending love. Paul and the apostles wrote many letters meant to convey this message of God's love.

NEXT WEEK

Paul explains how what God has done for us affects how we live now (Romans 6:1-14).

Family Devotions

As you hear and study these stories each week, consider what God has to say to you and your family. What is God's message to us? How should we respond?

Sunday—Read Romans [3:28-30] 5:1-11
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Peace and hope.

Choose one group of people to pray for this week.

Monday—Read Romans 5:12-14

Sin and death.

Think of a sin that you have committed. Pray together silently for forgiveness.

Tuesday—Read Romans 5:15-17

The free gift of justification.

Before reading this lesson, put the Bible in a gift bag. Talk about how the Bible is a gift.

Wednesday—Read Romans 5:18-19

Many will be made righteous.

Justification can be thought of as "Just as If I Never Sinned." Talk about how that makes you feel.

Thursday—Read Romans 5:20-21

Eternal life for all.

Talk about the thing you are most looking forward to in eternal life.

Friday—Read Genesis 3:1-7

Forbidden fruit.

Eat fruit while you read this story.

Saturday—Read Genesis 3:8-13

The blame game.

Count how many people are blaming others in this text.
