LAST WEEK

Paul elaborates on his major concern, the heart of the gospel message, which is the death of Christ as the fulfillment of God's promises (Romans [3:28-30] 5:1-11).

THIS WEEK

Paul explains how what God has done for us affects how we live now (Romans 6:1-14).

STORY SUMMARY

In this chapter of Romans, Paul refers to sin as a state of being rather than doing any particular actions. Our human nature is one of sinfulness, where we naturally act selfishly. But through Christ's death, we have all been forgiven and freed from this sinful state. This is entirely through Jesus' actions and nothing that we do. This free gift is grace. Our baptism is the means through which we receive this free gift and its connection to Jesus' death on the cross.

PRACTICE: SERVICE

There is nothing that we can do to earn God's grace or love. God has given us the gift of eternal life and forgiveness of sin through baptism. We respond to that gift in a number of ways: through worship, discipleship, and service to those in need. As a family, find a way to help one neighbor.

BIBLE NUTS & BOLTS

Bible Resources

It can be challenging to understand the Bible. It is a collection of books that were written in times and cultures that we do not understand, with customs that are unfamiliar, often translated with specialized words. There are many resources that are available to help us gain a better understanding of the Bible. A concordance allows the reader to find Bible passages about a specific word or topic. Bible dictionaries and encyclopedias explain words and topics. Commentaries give extended background and interpretations to help us understand the meaning of a text or story. Bible resources are available in print and online.

Family Devotions

As you hear and study these stories each week, consider what God has to say to you and your family. What is God's message to us? How should we respond?

Sunday—Read Romans 6:1-14

Freedom from sin.

Share one thing that you remember or have heard about your baptism.

Monday—Read Romans 6:15-19

Slaves to sin no more.

Read this section both in the NRSV translation and from *The Message* translation (both available online). Then share your understanding of the passage in your own words.

Tuesday—Read Romans 6:20-23

Freed for eternal life.

Share one word to describe what it means to you to be freed from sin.

Wednesday—Read Romans 7:1-6

Dead to the law.

Look online to find old, outdated laws. Which ones seem the most ridiculous to you now?

Thursday—Read Romans 7:7-12

The law shows us our sin.

If we never do anything wrong, we will never appreciate forgiveness. Think of one thing that you have done wrong for which you have been forgiven. Say a silent prayer of thanks for that forgiveness.

Friday—Read Romans 7:13-20

Sin dwells in me.

Try to read verse 14 though verse 20 out loud together. Now read it more slowly, so that you understand what Paul is saying.

Saturday—Read Romans 7:21-25

Jesus to the rescue.

Sometimes it seems easier to give in to sin. What is the temptation that is the hardest for you to resist? Say a prayer of thanks that Jesus rescues us from sin.
