
WIND SOCKS OF FIRE

Watch as the wind blows like the Holy Spirit.

We remember that the Holy Spirit came down with a rush of wind, and tongues of flame seemed to descend from the sky.

We are going to make wind socks to remember the wind that blew when the Holy Spirit descended.

- Color the dove image before cutting it out and attaching it to the construction paper. Choose a piece of red, orange, or yellow construction paper. (You can also decorate the construction paper!)
- Tape or staple the construction paper into a cylinder. Then attach pieces of red, orange, and yellow streamers to the bottom end of the cylinder.
- Punch three or four holes in the top of the cylinder and tie a piece of yarn through the holes.
- Collect all of the yarn at the top and tie into a knot. The cylinder will now hang like a wind sock.

Living the Word: Teaching Kids God's Story Narrative Lectionary, Year 1 (2022-2023) **Lesson #1-35**Acts 2:1-4; Romans 8:14-39

LAST WEEK

Paul explains how what God has done for us affects how we live now (Romans 6:1-14).

THISWEEK

Paul explains that Christ's death and resurrection changes us by giving us new life in Christ (Acts 2:1-4; Romans 8:14-39).

STORY SUMMARY

Jesus' followers had remained in Jerusalem after Jesus' resurrection because Jesus promised a Helper. On the day of Pentecost, they were gathered together. People were filled with the Holy Spirit as the sound of a rushing wind surrounded them and what looked like tongues of fire descended onto them. Pentecost was a Jewish festival, also called the Festival of Weeks, celebrated on the fiftieth day after Passover. It was a festival celebrating the new harvest and the giving of the Torah to Moses.

PRAGIGE SERVIGE

We have practiced fellowship, worship, prayer, and service. As we hear the story of Pentecost and the start of the church, it is appropriate that we work together to bring the message outside of the walls of the building. It is time to share what we have heard, and to live in such a way that others will experience the love of Jesus through us. Who will you share the story of Jesus with?

THEPOUT

God's gift of the Holy Spirit is a promise that nothing can separate us from God's love.

BIBLENUTS & BOLTS

The Holy Spirit

The Holy Spirit gave the people spiritual gifts. They were able to preach Christ's message to all who could hear. The Holy Spirit gave them the power to boldly proclaim the message of Jesus. The Holy Spirit also serves as our intercessor who hears our prayers and prays for us. Paul writes that the Spirit helps us in our weakness and intercedes to God for us "with sighs too deep for words" (Romans 8:26), for we are unable to pray as we ought. This is followed by the promise that God knows what is in the mind of the Spirit and therefore hears our prayers directly. We can pray with confidence, for we pray to God through the Spirit in the name of Jesus.
